## INCIDENTAL TOUR STOPS IN SEDONA, ARIZONA

---

Sedona has long been a popular place for tourism. Many companies take visitors through Sedona on their way to or from other destinations, such as the Grand Canyon. On these trips, buses, vans, and shuttles stop at iconic sites – like Bell Rock – and let visitors enjoy a brief stop on the national forest to take photos, use the restroom, and stretch their legs.

These visits (appropriately called “short stops” under National Forest policy) will require a permit. While some of the details are still being worked out, there are a few things we already know:

- The permit system will be designed to accommodate both in-advance applications and on-demand purchases.
- The permit fee will likely be based on the number of passengers per trip.
- All tour vehicle types will be allowed at Bell Rock Vista, Oak Creek Canyon Vista, and the Red Rock Ranger District Visitor Center in the Village of Oak Creek.
- Passenger vans and shuttles will be authorized at additional locations, still to be determined.
